Our Mission and History

HatchHope For Humanity is a 501c3 Tax Exempt Non-Profit organization that has been established to provide help to disadvantaged communities. Our mission is to help one disadvantaged family at a time rise above the poverty level and create a better life for themselves and their families. We provide our services both by working with other organizations dedicated to helping those in need as well as providing services first-hand. Our organization is committed to providing assistance and support to individuals both internationally and domestically. HatchHope for Humanity was established in 2008 through the efforts of its founder Syeda J. Mansur.

A Message from the Founder and President

When Dr. Aziz, one of my professors at Howard Medical College, learnt that I was planning to establish free medical care in Bangladesh, he smiled and asked if I knew the story of Sisyphus. He was a king who was condemned by the Gods to spend eternity rolling a rock to the top of a mountain only to have the stone fall back to the base. After telling me the story, Dr. Aziz then added, "Given all the odds, the fact that you are still thinking of establishing free medical care in Bangladesh, is admirable."

With such encouraging words our HatchHope team started working on the project in May of 2011 with only \$149 in capital. Within a month we were able to generate over \$5000 in donations. By the grace of God we were able to recruit two physicians in Bangladesh, Dr. Nahar and Dr. Kowsar, who began volunteering their services on our behalf in the slums of Dhaka, the capital, and the villages of Chittagong respectively. To date HatchHope has provided free medical care to 160 patients in the form of medications and diagnostic procedures. Our team of volunteers and donors stands witness to the fact that no idea is trivial and no goal is impossible to attain. It is only through our collective effort and our common values of ethics and humanity that we were able to reach such heights from such a humble beginning.

Bangladesh is one of the most densely populated countries in the world, poisoned by arsenic compounds that flow into its Delta at the Bay of Bengal. According to United Nations reports it is also third on the list of counties that will lose a quarter of its coastline if the sea rises 3 feet in 50 years, thus displacing 30 million Bangladeshis from their homes. Water from the wells of coastal villages is now freckled with salt. It is a sign of the brackish water creeping into the soil, the lakes, the ponds, the rice paddies and the underground water supply that millions of coastal Bengalis use

to drink and use in agriculture, the primary source of livelihood for 90% of the population. Among other perils, Bangladesh is listed by the World Health Organization (WHO) as being sixth in the world with a tuberculosis endemic. It has become a serious public health issue among its citizens.

With this in mind, I find myself agreeing with the French-Algerian Nobel Laureate, Albert Camus, who wrote: "The struggle itself...is enough to fill a man's heart. One must imagine Sisyphus happy."

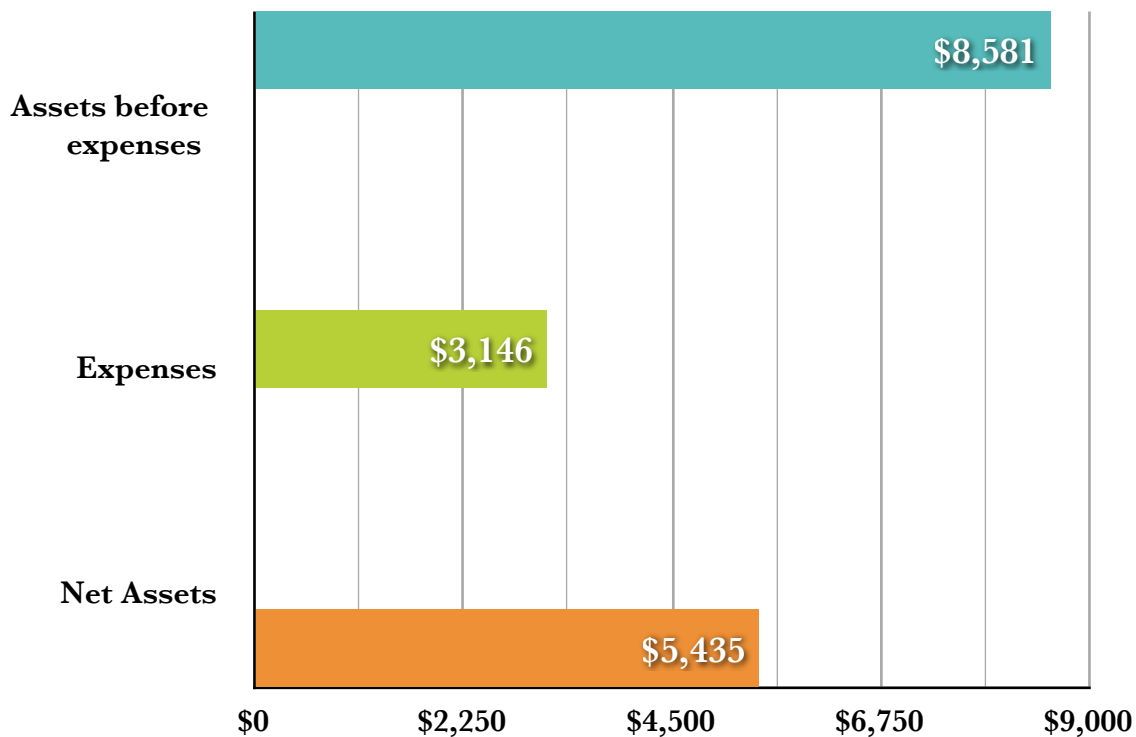


Mr. Md. Shekh, his wife, his seven year old daughter and six month old son, were the 2011 recipients of HatchHope's Family Uplift Grant.

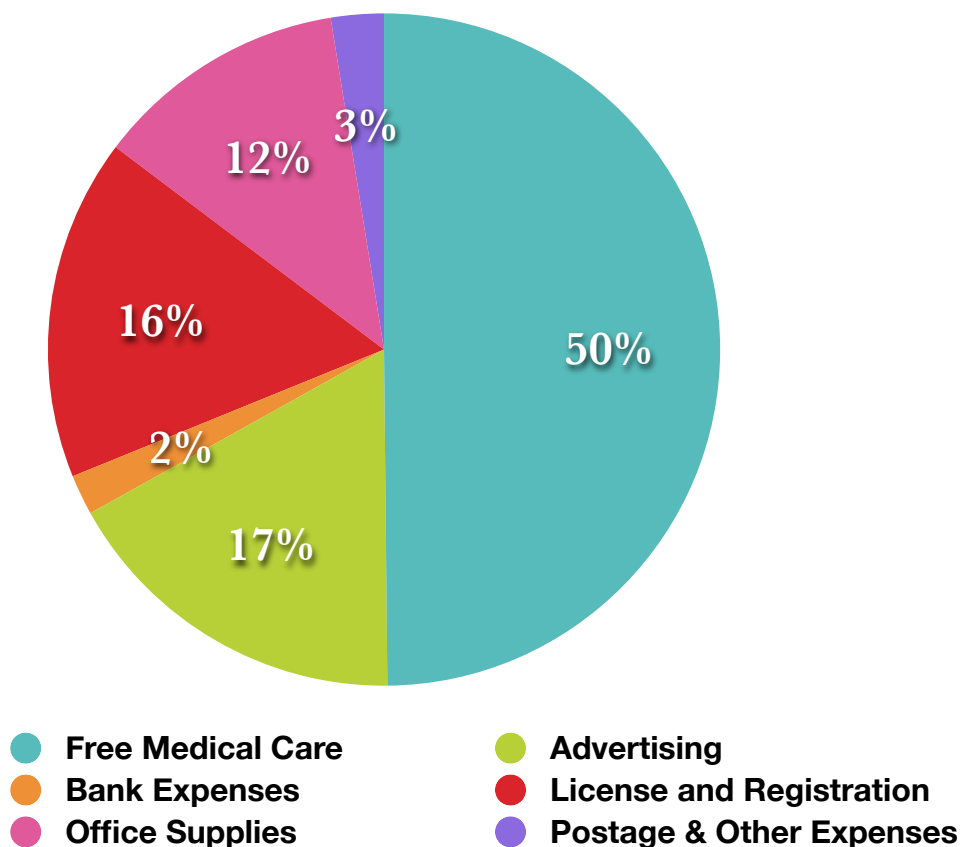


Financial Report: Assets and Expenses

Looking Ahead Goals for 2012

HatchHope for Humanity continually looks for ways to improve our current programs as well as adding new programs that serve the organization's mission. As our organization grows and our funding increases, we will be able to provide even greater services to those in need. In addition to fundraising, we also consistently look for other organizations with which we can work to help as many disadvantaged individuals as possible.

As we look ahead, our goal is to continue working on expanding the projects we have already established, but our new projects for 2012 would include the following:

- Establishment and expansion of high school chapter, Youth Awareness, at the Bergen County Academies in Hackensack, NJ (*Update: Chapter was officially established in January 2012*)
- Completing a proposal by July of 2012 and submitting it to various organizations to raise funds for the establishment of a free clinic in Bangladesh



- Begin focusing on viable projects to set up in Sudan and possibly Zimbabwe
- After sufficient observation and establishing trust, we will begin writing grant applications for projects geared towards Sudan.
